The Beautification Committee of the North Falmouth Village Association is hosting an evening social event and everyone is invited to attend. ## **Nye Park Playground Community Preservation Funds for Nye Park Playground**

The North Falmouth Village Association applied for Community Preservation Funds for the Nye Park playground improvements. Town Meeting voted to award \$26,000.00 for the purchase of playground equipment and a picnic shelter. The equipment was ordered and has been installed adjacent to the present standing facility. The equipment includes a wider variety of activities for a broader age range of children.

The equipment is age specific, including a 2 seat airplane rider, one saddle spinner, one 4-seat seesaw, one stand-up spinner, one 18” curved track ride, one sky rail climber, and one sit down merry-go-round.

This expansion of the playground was possible through a grant awarded at Town Meeting from the Community Preservation Funds.

**Postmark**

To celebrate the 30<sup>th</sup> running of the Paul White Memorial Road Race, an opportunity presented itself for commemorating the event with a US Postal Service pictorial postmark, depicting the date (07-07-07) with the logo designed by artist Jakob Michon. Obtaining authorization from Jakob to use his artwork, the NFVA submitted a request for a pictorial postmark for the 07-07-07 running of the Paul White Memorial Road Race. Jakob's design was accepted by the Board of Directors. The original sketch with minimal alterations, including the 30<sup>th</sup> year and the date 07-07-07 were superimposed on the character. The artist has given written permission for augmenting the design to meet the needs of the promotion. When you come to the Road Race, bring along plenty of postcards or letters and they will be cancelled with the logo that day!

The 30<sup>th</sup> Paul E. White Memorial Road Race (PWMRR), will be held Saturday, July 7th at 10 A.M., at Nye Park, North Falmouth. The Race application has been updated and includes a \$15 entry until July 1<sup>st</sup>, then \$20 from then to the day of the race. The 4.81 mile course begins and ends at Nye Park, with trophies awarded to the first second and third overall winners. Race applications will be available on our new web site [www.paulwhiteroadrace.org](http://www.paulwhiteroadrace.org), from which you may directly sign up and pay your entry fee on line using PayPal, or beginning in June, you may sign up at the Rockland Trust bank, Art's Bike Shop, Balanced Health & Fitness, and the lobby at Dunkin Donuts. ## **North Falmouth Historic Homes & Buildings Art Project**

Andrea Moore, an artist from the Cataumet Arts Center, has created a most fitting project for the coming 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the North Falmouth Village Association. She approached Executive Director Carolyn Powers of the Falmouth Historical Society (FHS) to explore ways of involving local art students in learning about the past. Through a grant to the Society, Andrea and FHS will collaborate with the NFVA in producing a commemorative brochure.

Andrea has recruited student artists, ages 11 to 18 years, to draw selected houses, which will be incorporated into the brochure. Some that have already been drawn include the Capt. Nathan Ellis house, the Old Nye Tavern, The Village Junction, the Mark Hatch house, the North Falmouth Congregational Church, and the Megansett Grange Hall home. The brochure, to be published in July, will be ready for the celebration of the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Association, planned to begin with the annual meeting on Friday, October 19, 2007 and continuing with an open house at the Village Junction on Saturday, October 20th. Self-guided

walking tours through the historic sites will be encouraged. The artistic brochure by Andrea's students will be the perfect guide.
