*President's Corner*

The March Board of Directors' meeting was opened to the membership to hear a proposal for a zoning change from "agricultural" to a "business 4 district" for a parcel of land on route 151 adjacent to Ballymeade. The owners, CLSV Associates, plan to develop the 31 acres for a 200-unit senior facility with grocery store, pharmacy and an intra-modal parking area. Jody B. Shaw, director of operations for the owners, presented the layout of the facility with drawings, and Diane C. Thompson, zoning consultant, reviewed the permitting process. Jeff Robinson, from the Salmon Health & Retirement Group, presented the living accommodations and amenities. Approximately 40 members joined with the Board in the North Falmouth elementary School Library to participate in a Q & A session regarding the impact on the Rte. 151 area. Traffic studies and wild life issues will be addressed upon the zoning proposal results to be held at a Special Town Meeting in April.

The Wild Harbor General Store is currently open for business under new owners. They are two North Falmouth families, Karyn & Dana Phares & Caryn & Garry Brake. A grand opening is planned for the Spring, and will feature a year round gourmet market with butcher shop, produce and specialty breads & cheeses.

More news is percolating about the North Falmouth Diner. A sign posted outside in the parking lot announces the Tin Man Is Coming.

We look forward with anticipation to the bustling activity in the village as we welcome springtime.
